Congratulations go to our Chief Instructor Belinda (Bindi) Adams who was awarded Surf Lifesaving Illawarra 2020-2021 Trainer of the Year.



The 2020/21 year saw Scarborough Wombarra Surf Life Saving Club ("the club") in somewhat of a rebuild phase due to the clear shortage of patrolling members.

The season turned out to be one of the most satisfying and successful seasons the club has ever seen. It started off with a review of the clubs sustainability and ended in a Presentation night that saw more than 120 members and their families attend.

Strategy

With the addition of some extra resources to the committee at the end of last year, a review of the clubs position was performed before the start of the season and discussed at the committee level. It was evident that the club's assets were in a good working condition to enable the beach to be patrolled, and that the club's balance sheet was extremely healthy, with ample funds in cash reserves. What was clear however, was that a drop in patrolling members challenged the future sustainability of the surf club, and the need for a recruiting drive was evident.

Following on from this review, the immediate goals of the club were:

- to use marketing and media outlets to help with the recruitment of members to see the club achieve an additional 2 patrol teams over the next 2 seasons; and
- to then look to focus on getting additional qualifications such as IRBC and IRBD in the following 1 to 2 seasons, in order to remove the need for any SLSNSW exemptions.

Recruitment and Education

The club had an extremely successful season in terms of recruitment. We were very fortunate to recruit 10 new Surf Rescue cadets, 24 new Bronze Medallions, 7 new Advanced Resuscitation Techniques Certificates, 3 Silver Medallions and 1 Gold Medallion (the first Gold Medallion anyone in the club has achieved in more than 20 years).

The addition of these new members means the sustainability of the surf club is sound for the interim period, something the club has found challenging over the past 15 years at least.

Awards

Congratulations go to Maeve Steller Rich who won our Nipper of the Year award. Maeve has been a member of our club since before she was 5 years of age, and this season she completed her Surf Rescue Certificate and joined in patrols on the beach. Maeve also came to each nipper event to help out with mentoring and assisting the junior nippers and assist with running junior events, and was well deserving of this award.



Congratulations also go to Bindi Adams. Bindi was awarded Club person of the Year award thanks to her energy and effort in training all the new members of the club. There is no doubt this award also acts as recognition for all Bindi's efforts in the President role she took on over the previous 5 seasons. A well-deserved recipient.

Bindi was also awarded Trainer of the Year at the annual Surf Lifesaving Illawarra Awards of Excellence night which is extra recognition of the efforts undertaken in educating our member base. Congratulations Bindi.

Committee

I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you to my fellow committee members. Without each committee member performing their role, the club would not be in the position it is in at the moment after such a successful season. Thank you to Bindi, Ian, Lisa, Joanna, Rick, Tommy, Sean, Gary and Rowena for all their efforts.

We are fortunate to say that again there were no lives lost on our beach this season, and this is largely due to the commitment of our patrolling members. This season saw more numbers on our beach than ever before, with Australia Day 2021 coming to mind as an extraordinary day, and our patrolling members turned up day in and day out ready to go.

Presentation Night

We concluded the season with a Presentation Night at Scarborough Wombarra Bowling Club where all the new members were presented their awards, and all members had the opportunity to enjoy a well-deserved social drink together. To have more than 120 people attending was fantastic to see and be a part of.

2021/22 is a year we again hope to build on what we have achieved over this past season in particular.

Branch

Patrols

The Australia day patrol stood out as we as a club had fantastic representation to cope with the never seen before crowds we had at Scarborough Wombarra beach, where we had an average of over a 100 people in the water throughout the day. The display of red and yellow brought a sense of pride in being a volunteer surf life saver and part of a greater team doing real good. To add to that the patrol went onto 6pm because of the numbers. It was great stuff from all involved.

Numbers on Scarborough Wombarra beach also meant our members were useful assisting the Council lifeguard(s) on Saturdays during the holidays. The lifeguard was appreciative of the preventions and help with questions from the public (a common one I found was if dogs were allowed on the beach, and the good ole "where are the toilets").

In other good news our "Help" patrol was taken over under the leadership of Ben Hamill. Ben has become a valued patrolling member in short time and I thank him greatly for taking on this patrol which takes load of our other 6 patrol teams.

The numbers on the beach definitely declined after the school holidays ended despite have some very nice conditions on the beach.

With new bronzes trained and awarded, patrol numbers were bolstered, it was nice to see more red and yellow on patrols and the extra enthusiasm.

Over the 20/21 season I think we performed very well indeed.

Branch

With Adrian Walsh at the helm, we have been able to keep abreast of all the major changes throughout what has been an especially difficult year, with the state-imposed COVID lockdown rules, and the introduction of new standards in delivery qualifications. We had some COVID rules relaxed for the season start, however, we were expected to maintain limited physical contact training for the whole season, making things quite difficult particularly with the water activities, however, we managed to take this in our stride. Another difficulty we face is the introduction of increased qualifications and standards, specifically for the ARTC and Advanced First Aid delivery, to be phased in through the offseason in time for next season. COVID has again caused major issues with the courses being postponed to sometime closer to the start of next season.

Club

What a season! We hit the ground running with Ant brining in a whole club's worth of new recruits, more than doubling our patrolling members before the season was out! Of course, we had to contend with new COVID rules, high temperatures causing training postponements and a whole other set of challenges, on-line course barriers, and the additional issues with massive surf. This resulted in constant Bronze/SRC courses running throughout the whole season, from the first weekend to the very last Sunday. The numbers were staggering, and the enthusiasm just brilliant, I'd do it all again in a heartbeat, especially now with Gary and Ben taking on some of the training components.

We have 8 SRC through with an additional 2 to have their paperwork submitted later this month. A further 24 Bronzes over two sessions and another 5 to be saved for next season and 1 carried through from the 2019 season. Despite the obstacles we managed to put through another 7 ARTC.



We also extended our help to other clubs, running a SMBM course at Helensburgh/Stanwell Park, giving the branch another 14 new patrol captains. Bulli SLSC helped us with our new SMBMs, giving the club 3 new patrol captains. There was also a preseason first aid course so that clubs could run the ARTC courses individually.

We were limited with our IRB work as we were without an operational IRB for some of the season, and the branch courses kept being cancelled or run at the same time as our other courses.




